RESOLUTION NO. 2333

A RESOLUTION OF THE GOLDEN CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING SYSTEM FOR RESIDENTIAL AREAS GENERALLY ALONG 9TH STREET BETWEEN MAPLE STREET AND WEST OF WASHINGTON AVENUE AND PORTIONS OF ARAPAHOE, CHEYENNE, AND ILLINOIS STREETS AS AUTHORIZED BY CHAPTER 10.90 OF THE GOLDEN MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, Chapter 10.90 of the Golden Municipal Code authorizes City Council to establish specific parking restrictions for certain residential areas around special generators as defined by Section 10.90.010(d) GMC; and

WHEREAS, City council believes that the use by the general public of public parks and facilities in the Clear Creek corridor on weekends during the summer justifies the need for establishment of parking restrictions in the residential area generally north of Clear creek and west of Washington Avenue.

WHEREAS. City Council has received and evaluated a request for establishment of such specific parking restrictions, often referred to as a permit parking system, and has considered input and testimony by interested parties.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDEN, COLORADO:

City Council hereby authorizes the establishment of a new permit parking system area, known as the 9th Street permit parking system area, to include the areas depicted on the map attached as Exhibit A hereto. The establishment of the permit parking system shall be according to the following provisions:

- a. Parking on the City streets shown on Exhibit A shall be restricted to residents only, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 10.90.050 and 10.90.060 Golden Municipal Code.
- b. The parking restrictions shall be in force during the period from 1 PM through 6 PM Saturdays and Sundays for the period of May 15th thru September 15th of each year.
- c. Signs necessary to implement the permit parking system for the area depicted on Exhibit A. shall be installed and enforcement of the permit parking system administrative provisions shall occur as soon as reasonably possible.
- d. This approval is valid only for the 2014 summer season, unless specifically extended by City Council resolution.

Section 2. City Council directs the City Manager to institute appropriate procedures and actions to administer the provisions of the system.
