Definitions:

<u>Apartment Building</u> means an exclusively residential structure having more than one residential unit for rent or lease, without the possibility of individual ownership.

<u>Condominium Building</u> means an exclusively residential structure having more than one residential Condominium Unit within the structure, together with undivided fee simple ownership in the common elements appurtenant to such units, but which does not also qualify as a single household attached unit building as defined herein.

• A single tap may serve Condominium Buildings.

<u>Residential Multi-Unit</u> means a building containing 2 or more dwelling units, and not otherwise classified as a commercial, Condominium Building or Single Household Attached Building.

• A single tap may serve Multi-Unit Buildings.

<u>Residential Single Attached Unit</u> means an exclusively residential building containing two or more dwelling units where each unit is attached by a common wall to one or more other units, but where units are not stacked above each other.

- Each unit in a Single Household Attached Building shall have a separate tap.
- A Single Household Attached Building shall be regulated as such regardless of ownership.

Residential Single Unit means a building containing one dwelling unit.

Each unit in a Single Household Attached Building shall have a separate tap.
 A structure containing a single household detached dwelling may, upon application to the City Engineer, be permitted to extend water and wastewater connections to an accessory building on the same lot, including for purposes of an Accessory Dwelling Unit, as defined in
 Section 18.04.020 of the code.

<u>Urban Residential Multi-Unit</u> means a building that falls under the definition of "Apartment Building" or "Condominium Building" and has a separate irrigation tap for outdoor water usage.
