Voter Information

Mail Ballot Election Scheduled for Nov. 7

he last day to register to vote or change the address on a voter registration is now determined by the method voters choose to submit their registration.

If you want to receive a mail ballot, you need to be registered by Oct. 30, which is eight days before Election Day.

ANYTIME IN PERSON - INCLUDING ELECTION DAY

Go in person to any Voter Service Center or the Jefferson County Elections Division, 3500 Illinois St., Suite 1100, to register. You can also register on Election Day and receive your ballot. More information can be found at www.jeffco.us/elections.

To be eligible to register to vote in this election, you must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old on or before Election Day, a resident of Colorado, and at your present address for 22 days prior to the election.

If your Jefferson County voter registration is current and you live within the city limits of Golden, further registration is not necessary. If you are not sure if you are registered at your current residence, visit www.govotecolorado.com.

All registered voters will be mailed a ballot from Jefferson County the week of October 16. Your ballot must be returned to Jefferson County, or placed in a ballot drop box, no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 7.



BALLOT DROP BOX **AT CITY HALL**

There is a ballot drop box right inside the front door of Golden's City Hall, 911 10th St. You can drop off your ballot until Election Day, Nov. 7 at 7 pm. The box is securely locked and Jefferson County Election Department employees pick up the ballots every day.

Before you bring your ballot, check to be sure you have it in your envelope (family members with the same last name often get theirs mixed up); sign the back of the envelope, and include all required information. Seal the envelope before dropping it in the box.

Your Introduction to the City Council Candidates

To help voters make educated decisions in the upcoming mail ballot election, the City of Golden publishes candidate profiles for each of the races. In this election, City of Golden voters will elect a Mayor, and Councilors for District One and District Two. If you are not sure in which district you reside, call the City Clerk's office at 303-384-8014.

Each candidate was offered the opportunity to submit a profile and a photo for free publication by the City. Candidates were not provided with any set of guidelines (other than an approximate word count) and candidate profiles were not edited by the City for content, grammar or style. The candidates are in the same order as they will appear on the ballot.

3 BALLOT MEASURES ON THE NOVEMBER 2023 BALLOT IN THE CITY OF GOLDEN

In addition to City Council elections, there are three referred measures on the ballot that City of Golden voters will decide on in November. The three measures include:

- Ballot Issue 2K, which pertains to a property tax increase to fund the capital needs and operational costs of the Golden Fire Department,
- Ballot Issue 2L, which pertains to retaining and expending revenues received by the lodging tax in 2022 to be used as originally approved by voters, and
- Ballot Question 2M, which pertains to describing City officials with generally applicable terms.

If you're a registered voter, you'll receive a ballot information booklet, otherwise known as the "Blue Book," with ballot language and Pro/Con statements, in the mail this month.

MAYOR CANDIDATE Heather Schneider

MAYOR CANDIDATE Waquim Filsaime

Waquim Malik Filsaime (born April 2nd) the Executive Chairman of Perseverance Endeavors, Inc - a national conglomerate holding company and the Interim CEO of Filsaime Flavors- a quick-service restaurant positioned for herbivores. The son of parents from Haiti and Pennsylvania, Filsaime was born and raised in St. Petersburg, Florida. After serving as a District Manager of Denny's, he launched his very first restaurant - Filsaime Flavors.



MAYOR CANDIDATE Charlie Sturdavant

Let me introduce myself to those that do not know me. I am Charlie Sturdavant, founder and brewmaster of the award-winning Golden City Brewery (GCB), a successful business my wife and I started 30 years ago. We have lived half our lives in Golden and have two grown Goldenite children who now operate our brewery.

My past experience in Golden includes 8 years on the Parks and Recreation Board, 11 years as Cubmaster and Scoutmaster, 3 years as a volunteer track coach at Golden High School, and 30 years as an ambassador for the craft beer industry. During my time on the parks board, I was involved or instrumental in building the Community Center, the Whitewater/Kayak course, White Ash Mine Park, New London Mine Park, Kinney Run Trail, and Fossil Trace Golf Club, among others.

GCB hosts special events every year to raise money for the Christian Action Guild (our local food bank), the Golden Volunteer Fire Department, Golden Landmarks Association, Foothills Art Center, and the Lions Club.

I think we are privileged to live in Golden, a great city. There are many things for which to be thankful in this town. We have many outdoor activities such as hiking and bike trails, the Alpine Center, climbing on the palisades of North Table Mountain, a world-class golf course, a critically acclaimed recreation center, and fishing in Clear Creek. We also have a nationally known RV Park and a history park. We have special events that attract visitors and locals alike, such as Buffalo Bill Days, Golden Fine Arts Festival, and First Saturday Classic Car Cruise.

Parking is the single most important issue to our citizens. The rules, permits and fees are complicated and confusing to everyone. The city has been removing parking from downtown, frustrating residents and visitors. Without parking, our businesses will suffer. Since the late '90's I have proposed that we build an outlying parking structure that is large enough to accommodate high traffic events, one that is open enough to make people feel safe. A shuttle could transport people downtown and back. I will continue to fight for this.

Golden's 2030 Vision Plan was developed by citizen input from throughout the community. The top priorities cited in this study were to retain Golden's small-town character, its historic nature, and have a fair and responsive government. City Hall has deviated from the 2030 mandate. I will work to give the Historic Preservation Board more authority to retain the small-town character that remains. We need to consider a 2040 Vision Plan.

I want to get more citizens involved in Golden's governmental process. I think City Hall does not respect them, being dismissive and condescending at times. This must change to make people less fearful of voicing their opinions.

I have heard it said that the nine most feared words in America are "I'm from the Government, and I'm here to help". I'll close in saying I'm from the people, and I'm here to help.




- We have a problem with parking and could add shuttles at other parts of Golden to alleviate the cluster (Possibly at the high school)

- I am an 8 year veteran air force/army!!!!!!! I LOVE GOLDEN!!!!!!


DISTRICT ONE CANDIDATE **Matt Duncan**

Through my career and volunteerism, I have gotten to know this city and its citizens well. Beyond Golden, I have been part of several organizations focused on water quality within the Clear Creek basin and an adaptive ski instructor.

My priorities for council will be to return the focus back to core city responsibilities including:

- Funding, organization, and operations of emergency services
- Public Works & Infrastructure funding and modernization
- Traffic Management, focused on better movement through town
- Public Spaces and connectivity across all of Golden
- Fostering robust businesses throughout town, including an evaluation of workforce housing
- Community Involvement public events and local opportunities
- Finalizing and Implementing the Clear Creek Corridor project, including new city facilities

There are countless reasons people want to make Golden home, and as a member of council, I would focus on maintaining the positive attributes of Golden while working to address the negative. Those would include better traffic coordination, downtown creek use, business development, and community events.

The role of council, and my focus, will be to listen to residents and address issues or ideas as they come forward. Not every concern can have a solution, but every concern can be heard. The diversity of Golden is what makes it great, including all levels of education, careers, hobbies, ages, and backgrounds. Golden is a community where everyone can participate.

I ask for your support in electing me to the City Council. I will be focused on policies to move Golden forward and maintain the small-town feel we enjoy, supporting our businesses, and keeping recreational activities abundant while acknowledging that the budgets fluctuate, but core services must be maintained.
