This creates an environment that may be less likely for people of color to want to join the Golden community, which is such a special place and could only be stronger and more beautiful with diversity. A question I have, understandably, heard from many is "Why is Golden doing this as it is not that diverse". Maybe we consider how we design for our current world and our future world.
