FAQ

1. What is a temporary sign?

Any sign, banner, pennant, valance or other outdoor advertising sign constructed of light fabric, cardboard, plywood, paper, corrugated wood, canvas, vinyl, or other light materials, with or without a frame, or any sign not permanently affixed either into the ground, to a foundation or to a building.

2. Does a temporary sign require a permit?

While a temporary sign does not require a permit through the building department, the planning division must do an administrative review of the sign before installation.

3. How do I receive an administrative review of my sign?

Email planning@cityofgolden.net with a simple sketch that includes the type of sign, size of sign, and location of sign.

4. How many temporary signs can I have?

One per street frontage per establishment. Temporary signs may not be located in City right of way or on balconies, fencing, barriers, landscaping, or railings.

5. How long can a temporary sign be up?

The time limit for a temporary sign is 45 days.

6. How large can the temporary sign be?

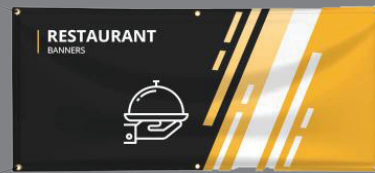
The maximum size is 32 square feet and it may not extend above height of wall to which it is affixed. Banner signs may not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ the length of the individual store frontage to which they are affixed.

Detached Banner

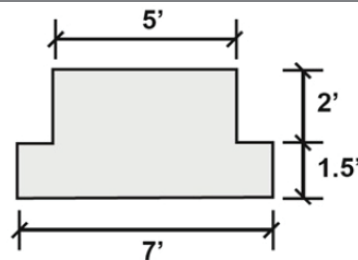


Attached Banner

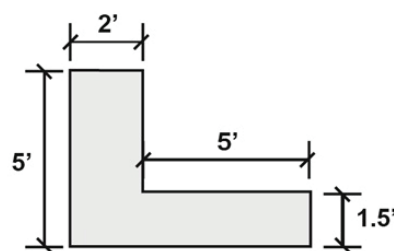
? What is right of way ?

- Signs are not permitted within a road right of way or obstructing any sidewalk or hand rails

The right of way is the area between the sidewalk and road. The City may remove signs placed in the right of way without warning so play it safe and keep signs on your own property.



Sign Area = 20.5 sq.



Sign Area = 17.5 sq. ft.
